However, this article is about the other type of sprinkler in our built environment. Fire suppressing sprinkler systems in buildings are recommended by the insurance industry if the Fire Department response in an area is more than seven (7) minutes. If less, they do more damage to a building than a fire. However, they can save a fire fighters life as they enter a building to look for unconscious survivors. Therefore, the International building code (which has been adopted by most states) requires them in all new buildings including one family homes. They are also required in some renovations under specific circumstances.

Our Iconic Building of the Month is Notre Dame, Paris, France

The building is 157 feet wide and 420 feet long. It has two (2) towers each 226 feet high.

There was one spire that was 300 feet in height.

In the fire this year the spire collapsed through the ceiling of the cathedral.

Iconic Building Of The Month

Notre Dame, Paris

The cathedral is considered to be one of the finest examples of French Gothic architecture. Its pioneering use of the rib vault and flying buttress, it's enormous and colorful rose windows, and the naturalism and abundance of its sculptural decoration set it apart from the earlier Romanesque style. Major components that make Notre Dame stand out include one of the world's largest organs and its immense church bells.

The cathedral's construction was begun in 1160 and was largely complete by 1260, though it was modified frequently in the following centuries. In the 1790s, Notre-Dame suffered desecration during the French Revolution.



Popular interest in the cathedral blossomed soon after the publication, in 1831, of Victor Hugo's novel Notre-Dame de Paris (better known in English as The Hunchback of Notre-Dame). This led to a major restoration project between 1844 and 1864. The liberation of Paris was celebrated within Notre-Dame in 1944 with the singing of the Magnificat. Beginning in 1963, the cathedral's facade was cleaned of centuries of soot and grime. Another cleaning and restoration project was carried out between 1991 and 2000.

The cathedral is one of the most widely recognized symbols of the city of Paris and the French nation. Approximately 12 million people visit Notre-Dame annually, making it the most visited monument in Paris.

While undergoing renovation and restoration, the roof of Notre-Dame caught fire on the evening of 15 April 2019. Burning for around 15 hours, the cathedral sustained serious damage, including the destruction of the fleche (the timber spire over the crossing) and most of the lead-covered wooden roof above the stone vaulted ceiling.

This month our Iconic Building is Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. This year it suffered the results of a fire in its attic. This fire started out so small it was not even noticed when a guard went to check out a smoke alarm which sounded. It grew until it completely engulfed the exterior roof, all of the centuries old timber which was its structure and caused the spire to collapse and break through the beautiful store arches of the ceiling. Even though Notre Dame has had numerous renovation and restoration projects over its entire life sprinklers were not added. For the most recent restoration, even though fire sprinklers were recommended by experts they decided not to install fire suppression sprinklers in the attic because it was not "period to the building. This means that when the building was built there were no fire sprinklers. They instead installed smoke detectors and created a program whereby if one sounded a staff member would go into the attic and look for signs of a fire.

Well this occurred just fine on that faithful day. However, the inspector did not see signs of a fire and ignored the alarm. The rest is unfortunately history for one of the most beautiful buildings in the world and an emotional and historic site for the people of France.
